ASPE CERTIFICATION, By Dennis Gleason

The American Society of Professional Estimators (ASPE) offers a Certification Program for qualified applicants. To qualify to become a Certified Professional Estimator (CPE), applicants must have at least five (5) years of estimating work experience.

The ASPE certification process requires the

candidate to: (1) Write a 2500 word technical paper on a construction-related topic, (2) Take a General Knowledge Exam (GEK) consisting of over 500 questions across a broad variety of construction topics, (3) Take a Discipline Specific Test (DST) if available or develop 100 questions. This exam is a test of the candidate's

specific area of expertise. Currently, ASPE has Discipline Specific Tests in the following categories: General Estimating, Earthwork, Concrete, Roofing, Drywall Systems, Painting, Plumbing, HVAC Piping, HVAC Sheet Metal, and Electrical.

So, what has being a CPE done for me? You

may find yourself asking that question when looking at what you need to become certified but having gone though the process I believe it has paid for itself ten fold. Having been an Estimator and Designer for ten years prior to joining the ASPE, there was nothing that I could produce to a potential employer or contractor that indicated that I brought to the table a certain amount of experience and expertise, other than possibly word of mouth through the industry. Now that I have attained the CPE status, I personally feel a sense of accomplishment. Everything that I did to attain my certification was what I did everyday. Until I participated in the program, did I realize the magnitude of the position. At work when I was participating in a team meeting, the topic was around estimating programs, and getting a better handle on the process within the company. I stepped up and offered to participate in the evaluation process. The question posed to me was on the line of, what do you have to offer. When I indicated that I was a CPE, their attitude changed and now I not only have direct input into the process but I teach the estimating and design process across a multi state utility organization.

Your first step to becoming a CPE is to fill out the Workshop Application Form and return it to our Chapter Certification Chairman, Dennis Gleason, by October 1st. The application form is available on-line. Once accepted, you will be contacted by Dennis to attend a Certification

Workshop or you will be offered to conduct your workshop on line at your convenience. Dennis will schedule the workshop sometime during November or early December.


